

Call for New Members for the Board of the Grand Lake Association



Membership

This year's membership stood at 215, which represents about 98% of the cottages on Grand and Green lakes. This past winter, 73 cottagers (34%) also signed up for Winter Patrol.

The new database and Grand Lake Directory will have double entries for surnames where indicated on the latest membership forms and in the order as submitted. There are 40 double names entered for this year. For your convenience, attached to this newsletter is a copy of the Membership form.

Treasury

Our treasury continues to reflect a strong surplus position, with reserves in excess of \$50,000 invested securely in CDIC insured instruments. As usual. our annual fees cover administrative costs, which are minor, and all **Association** events designed to be self-financing.

As most of you are aware, the Association maintains the reserve fund for contingencies and unexpected disasters that could arise and impact our Members.

We believe that it is prudent to continually seek means of increasing reserves creatively to allow us to be in a position to make a meaningful contribution to any significant problem that may surface, as well as provide critical funding to spending initiatives that could be brought to us by members to maintain or enhance the lake environment we all enjoy.

Environment

In cooperation with the Federation of Lakes of Val-des-Monts, Grand Lake has been regularly testing the quality of the lake water for the past number of years.

the spring, we test for Phosphorous. which is the primary nutrient/fertilizer for water year's plants. This results reflected similar levels to last year, and no alarming upward trend is indicated. The Federation tabulates the results from a number of lakes in Val des Monts. and we rank middle of the pack. Throughout the summer we test the water clarity using a Secchi disk. Some variability is to be expected but overall the lake continues to be quite clear.

During swimming season we will test for e-coli.

FYI: Phosphorus in detergent and shampoos end up in lake waters and many lakes in Canada are dead or dying. It is our responsibility to preserve our lake and encourage others to do so as well. Make sure ALL your cleaning products are phosphorous free, and that all water containing cleaning product residue gets filtered by your septic system.

Grand Lake is a member of the Federation of Lakes of Val-des-Monts. We believe Federation is a very good vehicle for communicating the concerns of lake-front property owners to the municipality and on up the political food chain. information about the activities of the Federation, check the web site http://www.federationdeslacs.ca

Note that Water Quality Day this year is at Parc Thibault (Chemin du Parc) at 10AM on June 10. It would be great if we could show some "Grand" support for the important work of the Federation-it is also a very informative venue and opportunity to share ideas.

Boating and Swimming Safety

EVERYONE who operates a motorized pleasure water craft (PWC) must carry on board at all times a proof of competency (such as a Pleasure Craft Operator Card, a Boating Safety Course Completion Card, proof of the successful completion of a boating safety course, or a certificate or other document pertaining to boating safety). Proof of competency is not required for pleasure craft without motors. Visit www.boatingsafety.gc.ca to get details.

Action Checklist for Recreation and Water craft Use:

- All watercrafts (powered or not) must be equipped with navigation lights.
- Operating a boat or PWC if you are under age is subject to a fine of \$100.
- Scan constantly for people, objects and other watercraft on the water.
- Be alert for conditions that limit your visibility or block your vision of others.
- As you leave or arrive at your dock with your boat or PWC, you MUST use a 90 degree angle in order to avoid unnecessary wake (causing shoreline erosion), hitting swimmers or collision with other boats.
- Please practice water sport activities as far as possible from the shoreline where the lake is wide and clear of obstructions. This will reduce, although not eliminate, the damage of wakes on our precious shores.
- Swim in designated swim safe zones (100 feet) and boaters use extreme caution in these zones where most people swim.
- Be visible at all times while swimming. There have been reports of swimmers crossing the lake without proper accompanying spot boats. This is a very dangerous situation.

List of Services or Contractors Available to Grand Lake Residents.

We are often asked for recommendations on services or contractors that could help Grand Lake residents in their various projects. Examples are: dock repairs, snow removal from the cottage roof, outboard motor or major appliance repairs, housekeeping, house-sitting. If you are aware of a reliable service provider or contractor, including lakers who have special skills to offer, please let any member of the Executive know and these people will be contacted to verify if and how they want their skills to be promoted (mailout to members only, website posting for fees as outlined below under "Website"). If you are not web savvy, no fear- call any member of the Executive and they will help you sort this out.

FYI – Points of Interest

We are closely following any indications of development activities that could impact our lake and environment in any way, and regularly meet with appropriate representatives of the various authorities who have some role in this domain. A committee of past presidents and our incumbent president has a mandate to make appropriate enquiries and report regularly to the Executive and in due course to the members. If you are aware of any such activities that warrant further research, please advise one of our executive whose co-ordinates are on page 8.

Poker Run 2012

Walking Trails Work Parties



Maintenance of the two hiking trails at the North end of Lac Grand continues. From the trail head dock just to the right of the northernmost channel of the lake two trails through beautiful woods lead to the heights above Lac de la Montagne (to the east), and, to outlook points above the Culbute (to the west). Maps are available at the sign-in box at the trail head. Out and back trips in each case take about one and half to two hours.

The trails are marked with white blazes - generally on the right hand side of the trail. A single white blaze means continue along the trail in the same general direction; a set of double white blazes indicates a turn with the higher mark indicating the direction of the turn. We are gradually adding more blazes to make following the trail easier but without adding too much visual pollution to the woods! In the

meantime, tricky parts are also marked with fluorescent flagging.

The trail is maintained by the foot falls of casual hikers and through organized work parties. Volunteers are always welcome. This season, work parties (actually hikes combined with debris removal, branch trimming and installation of blazes) will take place on Sunday, July 15th, Sunday September 16th and Saturday October 13th at 11am in each case departing from the Trail Head.
